Collage	The combining and assemblage of multiple images from different sources to create an artwork	<ul> <li>EXPRESSION AND VOICE- KEITH HARING</li> <li>Key Facts: <ul> <li>Keith Haring was born in 1958, in Pennsylvania, USA.</li> <li>Keith Haring is known for colourful, cartoon artworks and certain characters and motifs, such as crawling babies, barking dogs and spaceships.</li> <li>When he was 20 years old he moved to New York City and was part of the LGBTQ+ community in New York.</li> <li>Haring's popularity grew from his spontaneous drawings in New York City subways - chalk outlines of figures, dogs, and other stylised images on blank black advertising spaces.</li> <li>After gaining public recognition, he created colorful larger scale murals, many commissioned. He produced more than 50 public artworks between 1982 and 1989, many were created voluntarily for hospitals, day care centres and schools.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
