Processes and Techniques – By Hand

Collage

A collage is a form of visual arts in which visual elements are combined to create a new image that conveys a message or idea. Collage comes from the French word "collér," which means "to glue," often the primary means of combining images in collage art.

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Animation

Animation is a method by which still elements are manipulated to appear as moving images. In traditional animation, images are drawn or painted by hand on transparent celluloid sheets to be photographed and exhibited on film. Today, most animations are made with computer-generated imagery (CGI).
