Gareth Thomas is one of Britain's Greatest ever International Rugby players.

He played 100 times for Wales and also captained the British Lions, before retiring from the sport in 2010.





Following his Rugby career, Thomas went on to become a pundit for the sport, before featuring on Reality TV shows *Celebrity Big Brother*, *Dancing on Ice* and *The Jump*.





Last weekend Thomas took on the Ironman Triathlon, a competition that involes:


- A 2.4 mile swim
- A 112-mile bicycle ride
- A 26 mile marathon





Thomas completed the event in just over 12 hours, an amazing achievement.

Why are we talking about HIV?

Last weekend, International Rugby player Gareth Thomas - who played 100 times for Wales and captained the British Lions - revealed to the world via Twitter that he was HIV positive.

He made this <u>announcement</u> just hours before taking on the Ironman Triathlon, which involved a 2.4 mile swim, a 112 mile bike ride and a full marathon.

Stigma

In a BBC documentary, airing tonight on BBC Wales at 9pm and afterwards on BBC iplayer, Thomas speaks about wanting to show how people with HIV are misrepresented as "walking around with walking sticks who are close to dying".

Thomas also made the headlines back in 2009 for announcing that he was gay. He was the first professional Rugby player to "come out" and he received huge waves of support for his courage and bravery.
